What is No Pens Day Wednesday?

The aim of the day is to encourage spoken language and listening skills and raise awareness of their importance in education and beyond.

Children's learning will be focused on communication and the spoken language. Writing that takes place, will be done collaboratively and lessons and activities will have a focus on spoken language skills rather than writing skills.

Why are we taking part?

Reading and writing are very important and valuable skills but people are often not aware of how important spoken language and listening skills are too. Schools that include spoken language in a planned and structured way for children in their lessons see improvement in their classroom involvement.

Moorlands Curriculum

The Moorlands curriculum is based around communication, questioning and vocabulary. This is consistently shared with the children.
