Years 1 and 2 – 1.30 pm

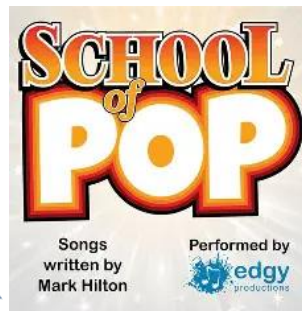
Years 3 and 4 – 2.00pm

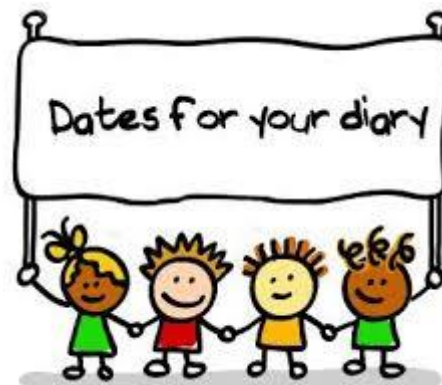

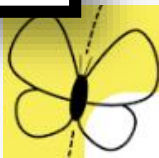

Attendance – Attend today, Achieve tomorrow.

Regular school attendance is crucial for academic success, social-emotional development, and future opportunities. Consistent attendance helps pupils build strong academic foundations, fosters positive peer relationships, and prepares them for the expectations of the workforce.

Evidence shows that poor attendance impacts on GCSE's achievements.

As part of our drive to ensure that all pupils attend school consistently and on time, the governors are providing an Attendance raffle for parents. Every 4 weeks, children whose attendance is 97% or above and have arrived on time will be entered into a raffle, the winner will be provided with a **£100 Love to Shop voucher**.

To be in with a chance of winning your child needs to be in school.

Extra play Monday – the class with the highest attendance on a Monday will have the opportunity to have extra play in the afternoon – as part of the co-operation value, being in school will help your peers.

Golden ticket Friday – each class will have one golden ticket, which can be found under one chair in the classroom. The winning child from each class will win a prize. To be in with a chance of being the lucky winner, you need to be in school.

Attending school **regularly** helps to build **confidence** and develop vital **life skills**



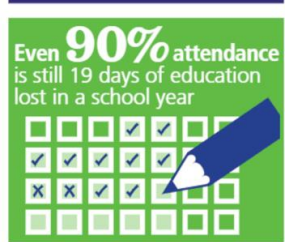
